## ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Adult & Youth Corps (AYC) Volunteer Program is a Toronto Police Service initiative designed to build a working relationship between the public and the police.

The program provides and opportunity for both youths and adults to work at their local police stations alongside the officers that serve their community.

## VOLUNTEER ROLES

Volunteer roles are designed to focus on crime prevention and support community mobilization initiatives.

Tasks may include: fingerprinting children at community events, instructing child seat installation workshops, participating at community events, station support, and aiding in supportive administrative functions.

## REQUIREMENTS TO BE AN AYC VOLUNTEER

Volunteering in a police environment is a commitment that takes much consideration and thought.

Becoming a police volunteer requires good character and an acceptance of the responsibility that representing the Police Service in the community entails.

Requirements to be considered for a volunteer position include:

- ✓ Be 14 years of age, or older
- ✓ Be a resident of Toronto
- ✓ Have no criminal charges pending
- ✓ Be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant
- ✓ Be of good moral character and values.
