## From the desk of Superintendent Gary Ellis

**W**ith the opening of the new 43 Division, on January 16, 2006, 42 Division also took on a new beginning. The purpose of building the new 43 Division was that the urban growth in Scarborough warranted a new station to make policing in this part of the city more manageable and community oriented. In the short time we have been the new 42 Division the move has proven to be a good one. Our police officers are no longer stretched across the vast 167 sq. km of what was 42 Division and can now focus on getting to know the people in the eight neighbourhoods that make up the



new 42 Division. Each of the neighbourhoods has its unique characteristics, strengths, and problems and to address this we have assigned officers to these specific neighbourhoods to be the 'experts' on what is going on and to work with those in the area to solve the problems. We have already experienced success with the neighbourhood officers being right around the corner when a 17 year old youth fired a gun at another youth. The person with the gun was arrested after a short chase. In the same week, people in the neighbourhood notified police that the youth originally shot at had obtained a gun—he was arrested in short order, thus stopping the cycle of violence that often follows this kind of behaviour.

Our Community Police Liaison Committee (CPLC) has worked with me to identify four priority areas in 42 Division that are in need of support and development that will ultimately make the areas safer. We have done walks in these areas and have met with key people who have educated us as to their needs. We will be returning to these neighbourhoods with the local politicians to elicit their support and develop strategies to improve the them. We have our challenges in that we are still one of the busiest and biggest divisions, however our dedicated and hardworking officers and volunteers are committed to ensuring that 42 Division remains one of the safest places to live, work, and play in Toronto.

seatbelt, think again!

into someone else's by accident? You know the pain that it can cause. Now multiply that by the forces exerted on the body when a vehicle impact happens. During the impact of two or more vehicles, an unbelted occupant becomes a projectile in that vehicle, and may cause severe injury to themselves and other occupants. Death, brain damage, or less serious injury are likely outcomes if two heads come in contact during a collision. So, if you are that one person in a car who thinks that you are the only one who will suffer if you don't wear your

If you cannot resolve the issues, I will step in and attempt to mediate a satisfactory resolution.

Elder abuse is known as the hidden crime as it is very rarely reported to the authorities. This is because on many occasions the victim is ashamed or afraid and the suspect is a family member or a friend.

Police investigations are conducted in a confidential, respectful manner.

I want to talk a bit about home security this month. Two things concern me. One is the number of household garages that continue to be entered through unlocked doors and belongings stolen and the second is door security.

The first is slightly easier to resolve and that is by simply locking the garage doors and leaving your valuable tools and equipment inside the locked garages.

I will spend a bit more time with the door security though. Many of our housebreaks involve breaking in either the front or back doors by simply kicking the door. We can make this a more difficult way to enter your home with a couple of reasonably inex-

pensive additions to your door hardware.

The strike plates where the deadbolts on the doors go into the frames are usually only held into place with two short screws and this is a very vulnerable point on most doors.
