Internet Crimes Against Children

Corporal Elliott Cohen, a ten year veteran with the Maryland Department of State Police, is currently assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division, Computer Crimes Section (CCS). The CCS heads the Maryland Internet Crimes Against Children, and is responsible for conducting criminal investigations relating to crimes facilitated by the use of computers and other areas of high technology.

Human Trafficking: A Canadian Perspective

Benjamin Perrin joined the UBC Faculty of Law in August 2007 as Assistant Professor, and is a Faculty Associate at the Liu Institute for Global Issues as well as the Peter Wall Institute for Advanced Studies.

Crime, Victimization and the Psychology of the Survivor

Ms. Dellandrea lectures frequently at National and Provincial legal forums in the areas of child exploitation, statement law, and search and seizure issues.
